Together Peel CAS, Community Family Services of Ontario, and the Newcomer Centre of Peel created the SEEA Wraparound Service Response that aims to address the unique needs of Southeast and East Asian community while also clarifying any misconceptions the community may have regarding our services. This wraparound model helps our clients of Asian descent access culturally competent resources while support families who are navigating multiple systems.

Community Family Services Ontario (CFSO)	<p>Community Family Services of Ontario provide psychotherapy and counselling services in Cantonese, Mandarin, Vietnamese and English. Supportive counselling can also be provided for Filipino families in Tagalog.</p> <p>However, since services are provided by Settlement Worker, the client must be IRCC eligible, which includes the following: immigration status requirements: live-in caregiver, PR, or convention refugee. They can provide support if DV is present – for client of ANY status.</p>	Referral requires written consent. Can also collaborate with Newcomer Centre of Peel.
Newcomer Centre of Peel	<p>We are primarily working with the Settlement Workers in School (SWIS) Team at Newcomer Centre of Peel. Newcomer Centre of Peel provides various services such as settlement, employment, LINC classes, youth and parenting support.</p> <p>Besides counselling for youth in crisis and volunteer opportunities in Mississauga communities, NCP also provides support and information on Universities, Colleges, OSAP and many other post-secondary resources.</p> <p>Settlement workers speak Cantonese, Mandarin, Tagalog, Korean and Vietnamese. The SWIS team is a fantastic resource to families of any status and provide support beyond the scope of newcomers.</p>	Referral requires written consent. Can also collaborate with Community Family Services Ontario.
